Dear Fellow Alumni,

The year 2024 marked a pivotal chapter in our journey to restore the University of Santo Tomas Hospital to its premier status. Thanks to your generosity, the Foundation Endowment Fund is now over \$9 Million dollars from its original goal of \$1 million dollars established in 1990. Only the interest earned from this fund is used to support grants to benefit the school, its students, the UST Hospital Clinical Division and the indigent patients it serves.



USTMAAA Foundation is committed to improving the Census at the Clinical Division; Providing free medical/surgical care to indigent patients; Providing Teaching materials for students, interns, residents and fellows and attracting Thomasian graduates to take up internship and residency at STUH. The Foundation has NO OVERHEAD expenses. Since its inception, all administrative and office expenses, rent and secretarial are borne by the Executive Office, so all donations go to the endowment fund 100%.

To date, we have donated over \$15 million dollars—including pass throughs—towards various projects and infrastructure improvements through various Class Legacies and Chapter Legacies.

Ensuring Our Future

The Saints Cosmas and Damian Center for Simulation and Research receives \$1M pledge from USTMAAA Foundation

In 2024, the USTMAAA Foundation proudly executed a \$1 million deed of donation to fund the state-of-the-art CME auditorium in UST's **Saints Cosmas and Damian Center for Simulation and Research**. The Memorandum of Agreement was signed by Dean Lourdes Maglinao, MD and the Foundation Board with name giving opportunities available for certain areas.

This transformative investment, part of our legacy for UST's 150th anniversary, empowers medical students, interns, and residents with hands-on training in a controlled environment. From virtual surgery modules to diagnostic ultrasound integration, the center equips future physicians with skills to excel in a rapidly evolving medical landscape.

This milestone builds on our 2022 commitment for the Simulation Center. By fostering innovation in medical education, we ensure that UST remains a leader in producing world-class healthcare professionals.

Along the with Simulation Lab, the building houses a state-of-the art auditorium dedicated to gatherings and continuing medical education. It will be permanently and irrevocably named as the **USTMAAA CME Auditorium**. Blessing took place on January 16, 2025, officiated by Rev. Fr. Rector Richard Ang, O.P. A wall of honor graces the center. This firmly establishes the legacy we have begun, and will continue to grow and thrive for generations to come.



Alaga at Tulong Tomasino:

From January 9–13, **Alaga at Tulong Tomasino**, our first in-house medical-surgical mission offered life-changing medical and surgical care to more than 2,000 patients. The goal of this first In-house Medical Surgical Mission was to improve census and provide clinical exposure to students, interns and residents at USTH Clinical Division by providing FREE surgery, medical consultations and medications to indigent patients.

Multi-Specialties Collaborate to Save Lives. Held across UST Hospital, UST Campus Open Gym, St. John Paul Pay Hospital, and St. John Paul Eye Center, the mission, led by Rev. Fr. Richard Ang, O.P., Rev. Fr. Julius Factora, O.P., Dr. Charito Malong, and Dr. David Bolong, delivered critical care to 2,138 indigent patients while shaping future healthcare leaders.

Compassion In Action. The mission's success is attributed to the dedication of 799 volunteers—289 surgical and 510 medical—who brought expertise and compassion to every procedure and consultation. Vital support, supplies, equipment and access to care was provided by sponsors like the USTMAAA Foundation, Ohana Hawaii Medical Mission 2023 (\$15,000 donation for 2023), UST Class of 1974 (\$30,000 donation for 2024), and Titans USA (\$15,000 for 2023 mission), alongside PhilHealth and OR discounts.

Education: A Cornerstone. A January 9 Cardiovascular Symposium, led by Dr. Dionisio Yorro and Dr. Jose Evangelista, tackled topics like atrial fibrillation, while a January 13 Surgical Grand Rounds, moderated by Dr. Alex Erasmo, explored renal failure. Students—clerks, interns, residents, fellows, and allied health professionals—gained invaluable hands-on experience.

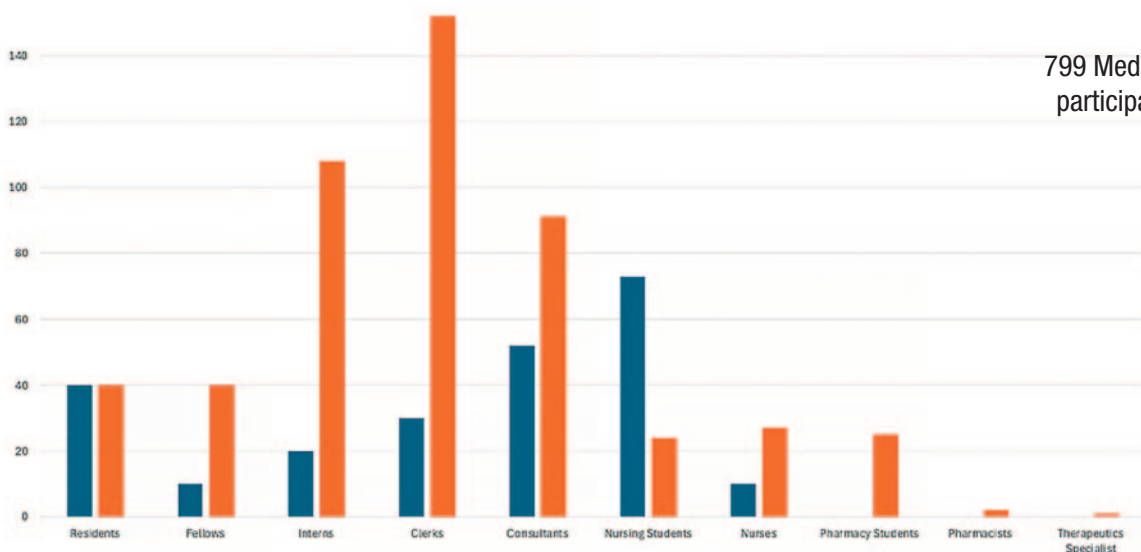
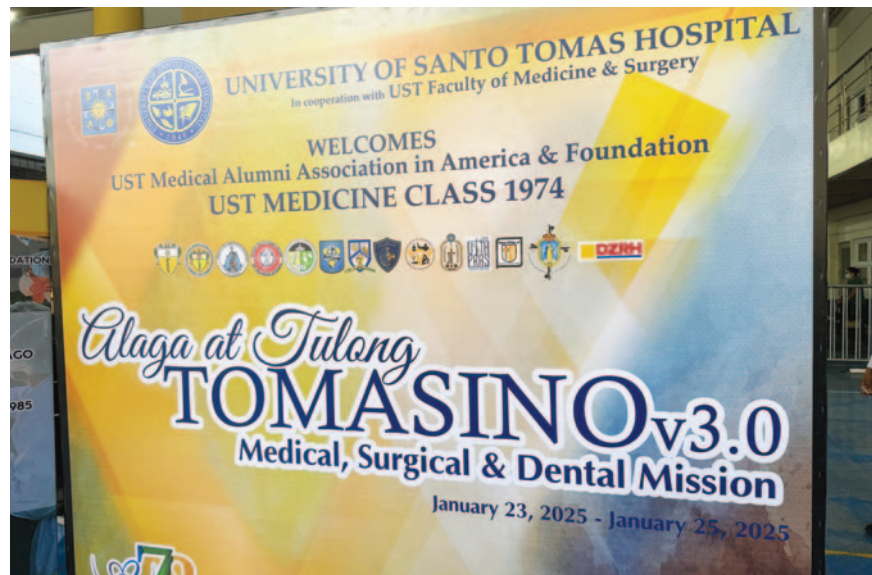
A Mission of Healing and Hope. Alaga at Tulong Tomasino was a triumph of care and collaboration. 2,138 indigent patients received consultations for conditions like cataracts, diabetes, and heart disease, with 141 undergoing surgeries such as cholecystectomies and cataract extractions. Over 600 left with eyeglasses, seeing the world anew. Three minor surgical complications were swiftly resolved, and patients received 2–4 weeks of medications with follow-up care at UST's Outpatient Department.



A Medical-Surgical Mission Like No Other



Looking Ahead. Future missions can build on this success by scheduling during school terms, clarifying volunteer roles, securing supplies early, and streamlining surgical days to reduce fatigue. This mission's legacy—rooted in compassion and education—sets a powerful precedent for UST Charity Hospital's commitment to transforming lives.

In January 2023, the University of Santo Tomas (UST) Charity Hospital launched its first in-house medical mission, "Alaga at Tulong Tomasino," a five-day community health initiative participated in by at least 800 medical volunteers that changed the lives of more than 2,000 patients.



Road to Recovery:

As 2025 closes, the shadow of COVID-19 has receded, but its effects remain at the University of Santo Tomas Hospital (USTH) Clinical Division. The conversion to a dedicated COVID-19 facility and the subsequent return to full operations inflicted critical damage: patient admissions plummeted, learning opportunities for residents dwindled, and operating revenues fell short of rising costs. Once the center of clinical excellence and education, USTH now faced imminent demise.

In 2023, the UST Medical Alumni Association of America (USTMAAA), together with hospital administration and university leadership, launched a coordinated recovery effort. Our strategy combined compassionate purpose with strategic action: targeted fundraising, operational support, and investments that would restore access, rebuild services, and protect training programs.

Central to this effort was a simple premise: patient-centered care is the road to recovery. **We revived the St. Martin de Porres Indigency Trust Fund to ensure underserved patients could receive high-quality care at no cost.** By covering clinical and surgical expenses and by supporting competitive staff compensation, the fund removed barriers that had kept patients away and allowed residents to continue training at USTH.

Alongside patient support, USTH invested in brand new, state-of-the-art cardiac cath lab equipment, a new CT scanner and MRI machine. USTMAAAF donated ECHO equipment, video-laryngoscope, EKG machines, a LAP tower, as well as a portable X-ray machine for use in the USTH Clinical Division. This strengthens in-house services, reduces referrals out, and improves continuity of care.

The principal continues to grow while the interest generated at a conservative rate of 5% annually, will be used to fund our projects in perpetuity. Remarkably, 80% of this amount will benefit directly the USTFMS and the UST Hospital, with the remaining 20% going back to the principal for inflation and growth. Thus we are positioned to distribute at least \$400,000 or P22 million pesos each year, ensuring sustainability of our essential programs and services in perpetuity. Your generous involvement will ensure that the spirit of UST continues to thrive and that healthcare delivery in the Philippines, especially to marginalized communities, is continually improved. It's an opportunity to create a meaningful legacy that resonates well beyond our lifetime.
- **WALL OF HONOR:** As part of our broader goal to reach a \$10 million endowment fund—equivalent to 58 million pesos, the USTMAAA Foundation is upgrading the Wall of Honor Monument to include new donors. The monument will be permanently displayed in a prominent location at the USTFMS. **We hope to have the BLESSING of the monument by January 2026.**

Our Mission in Action: Disaster Relief

In response to the devastation caused by typhoons Dante and Emong, which recently submerged portions of the University of Santo Tomas (UST) campus and its hospital in severe flooding, the University of Santo Tomas Medical Alumni Association in America (USTMAAA), through its foundation arm, has extended a \$10,000 (approximately 550,000) donation for disaster relief.

The contribution comes at a critical time for the UST Hospital, which experienced major operational challenges following the typhoons. Floodwaters left medical staff and patients stranded, while the loss of electricity forced the hospital to rely on generator power. Food shortages for 700 hospital personnel and fuel scarcity for generators compounded the crisis.

"This is about taking care of our colleagues, our indigent patients, and the community that UST serves," said Dr. Stella Evangelista, Executive Director of the USTMAAA Foundation. "We hope the donation has enabled the hospital to fast-track recovery efforts and resume essential medical services."

USTMAAA expressed gratitude to its members for their swift support and encouraged other alumni and partners to contribute to the ongoing relief initiatives. Donations will help sustain the hospital's recovery and ensure its readiness for future emergencies.

The mission began with the CME session Beyond the Scrubs: Lecture Series, featuring two Zoom speakers: Mr. Glenn Krause on Electronic Medical Records, soon to be introduced at USTH, and Mr. John Williamson on AI in Medicine. It also included three presentations on US training opportunities: Dr. Joshua Beloy (Matching Program), Dr. Mark Henry Joven (trained in the US but returned to the Philippines), and Dr. Alfonso Estrada (retired in 2017, now teaching house staff). These topics were suggested by UST physicians.

Executive Director's Report, 2023 - 2024 | by Executive Director Stella S. Evangelista, MD '68

A DEED OF DONATION was signed by the key officers of the USTMAAA and FOUNDATION who were involved in the Simulation Center fund-raising campaign. The Rector Magnificus, Rev. Fr. Richard Ang, signed on behalf of the University of Santo Tomas. The Dean of the USTFMS, Dr. Lourdes Maglinao and the Regent of the USTFMS, Fr. Angel Aparicio were also signatories and witnesses. One million dollars was pledged in 2023 and paid in full in 2024 for the Research and Simulation Center and in return we will be given naming rights to the **CME AUDITORIUM** and the names of the donors will be engraved on a plaque or Wall of Honor at the entrance of the auditorium.

The FOUNDATION ENDOWMENT FUND was transferred from Raymond James to JP Morgan Chase in Michigan. The amount transferred on January 22, 2024 was \$6,905,315.54. **A CASH MANAGEMENT ACCOUNT** was also opened at MERRILL LYNCH in the amount of \$1,500,000 earning 5% interest. \$500,000 was wired to the University of Santo Tomas as down payment towards our PLEDGE of \$1 million dollars for the Research and Simulation Center. St. Martin de Porres Indigency Trust Fund


